DISCOVERY CAMP 2009, 21st CENTURY COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS – MONTROSE CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

AESOP AND DRAMA – Grades 1-3, 2 weeks (1st session)

Remember the Hare and the Tortoise, the Lion and the Mouse, or the Ant and the Grasshopper? In this class we will read, view and learn about classic fables using theater games and performance.

PUPPET LORE – Grades 1-3, 2 weeks (2nd session)

Students will create puppets and put on plays based on folklore from around the world. Students will begin each day with a piece of children's literature to read and discuss. A writing activity will follow to strengthen reading and writing skills. The day will conclude with a creation of a stick, finger, or hand puppet and a play presentation based on the literature from the day. Students will present their favorite stories on the final day of class.

SCIENCE SLEUTHS – Grades 1-3, 4 weeks

In this four-part series, students will uncover some of the more fantastic facts about science. Through daily hands-on investigations, your Science Sleuth will be amazed at the world around them. There will be at least one field trip.

FUN IN THE SUN – Grades 1-3, 4 weeks

Do you want to keep your child physically fit throughout the summer? No video games here! Have your child come and enjoy a multitude of outside activities with their friends. Many of these activities will focus on the sports we played as children ourselves. Some of the sports and activities include: basketball, softball, kickball, dodge ball, flag football and an obstacle course filled with creative games. Don't let your child miss out on this exciting class.

*On those hot sunny days, please make sure your child is wearing sunscreen and has a water bottle.

AROUND THE WORLD IN 16 DAYS – Grades 4-5, 4 weeks

Students will engage in a whirlwind tour of the world. They will "visit" numerous countries to enjoy a multicultural experience. They will explore the geography and the people, play games and listen to music. They will learn about the food, art, holidays and special customs through interactive activities.

EXPERIENCE MUSIC PROJECT (EMP) - Grades 4-5, 2 weeks (1st session)

Students will *experience music* through the development of singing and instrument playing skills. Our project will include putting together a mock "American Idol" show and playing *real* Rock Band (not the video game), where students will compete for the highest score while learning drumming techniques.

STIR IT UP – Grades 4-5, 2 weeks (2nd session) and Grades 6-8, 2 weeks (1st session)

Whether you can cook like a pro or are just starting out, there will be something for everybody in this cooking class. Stop eating out! Eat at home and you'll eat better and spend less. The class will include basic cooking, quick meals, baking, gifts from the pantry and more! Come have fun with Ms. Mroczek while learning useful skills.

HOLY COW! – Grades 6-8, 2 weeks (1st session)

Sweating plants, barking owls, and grunting fish! Become an Earth Detective! Discover the reasons for plant and animal adaptations by creating your own mini-habitats after observing plants and animals interacting in different habitats while on field trips to the Ridgway Reservoir and the Gunnison River. You will learn about food chains, food webs, water, and nutrition cycles. Be prepared to explore!

JAPANESE ART AND CULTURE – Grades 6-8, 2 weeks (2nd session)

In this class students will learn Japanese Ceramics while making a rice bowl using the potter's wheel, practice Japanese Calligraphy while painting with a brush and ink, and make prints using wood blocks. Along the way we'll eat Sushi, drink green tea and learn to speak some Japanese.

THE REAL GUITAR HERO – Grades 6-8, 2 weeks (2nd session)

Students will learn a variety of useful *real-life* guitar-playing techniques, including tuning the guitar, playing with a slide, learning theory (like scales and chords), ear-training, fingerstyle vs. "flat-picking", and more. Watch as a group many of the popular DVD guitar instruction videos on the market today, and ask questions along the way. Your host, Kenny Ray, is a seasoned guitar veteran, with two music degrees and 20 years of professional (paid) performing and recording experience. Get ready to work *real* hard and play a *real* guitar . . . no games or toys here! (Warning: you may never view music video games the same way after taking this class!)
