Summer Breakfast and Lunch Program

Olathe and Northside Elementary Schools to Participate in USDA Summer Program

The Montrose County School District RE-1J will offer breakfast and lunch to area students this summer. According to Food Service Director, Kathy DeTonto, "Children in Montrose and Olathe do not need to go hungry this summer. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Summer Food Service Program helps fill the hunger gap."

Meals will be provided to all children without charge, as part of the United States Department of Agriculture's Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). SFSP is the single largest Federal resource available for local organizations that want to combine a feeding program with a summer activity program for children. During the school year nutritious meals are available for children through the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs. But those programs typically end when school ends for the summer. That is no longer the case! Every Monday-Thursday (kitchens will be closed on Fridays) from June 1, 2009 until July 9, 2009 the following meals will be available for area students:

- **Olathe Elementary will serve breakfast from 7:30 am to 8am**
Olathe Elementary will serve lunch from 12:00 noon to 12:45 pm
- **Northside Elementary will serve lunch from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm**
- **Centennial Middle School will serve breakfast from 8:00 am to 8:30 am**
Centennial Middle School will serve lunch from 12:00 noon to 12:45 pm
